FSPMA mission

Our organization was established in 1960 with three main objectives:

- Determine the nature, extent, and quality of non-instructional services required for the educational program, and to promote the development of these services by establishing the acceptable policies, standards and practices.
- Develop a working relationship with school administrators, managers, non-instructional and instructional personnel to foster the programs through adequate facilities and environment.
- Promote the professional advancement of school plant maintenance, operation, safety, energy management and environment.

Overview of Program

With the approval of the Florida Department of Education, the FSPMA has developed the Safety, Casualty and Sanitation Inspector Certification Program for use in educational facilities in the State of Florida. This program is designed to provide skills, tools and knowledge for inspecting educational facilities as required by the State Requirements for Educational Facilities (SREF). Training programs will be offered through the FSPMA at the annual conference and in regional offerings sponsored by the FSPMA.

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Certification Requirements

Certification will require 120 hours of classroom instruction. Two levels of certification will be provided.

Associate SCSI (60 Credit Hours) and Certified SCSI (120 Credit Hours).

Integrated Pest Management (8 CEUs)

Indoor Air Quality EPA Tools for Schools (8 CEUs)

SREF Existing or New Facilities (16 CEUs)

Life Safety Awareness (8 CEUs)

Sanitation Custodial Module 23 (6 CEUs)

CREDIT FOR DEGREES OR CERTIFICATIONS

Additional credit can be obtained for 2 or 4 year degrees and other certifications.

Only one in each category will be accepted as follows:

- A four year degree from and accredited university in the field of safety, health or environmental sciences.
- Certifications (with prior Committee approval):
 - Certified Indoor Air Quality Inspector or equivalent
 - Certified Playground Safety Inspector
- A 2 year degree from and accredited university in the field of safety, health or environmental sciences.
- Prior experience working as a Safety, Casualty and Sanitation Inspector in an educational setting as follows:
 - less than 5 years – 30 CEUs
 - more than 5 years – 60 CEUs

Notes on Credit Awards and Certification:

- Credits for two and four year degrees will receive a one-time credit
- All courses and certificates not noted must pre-approved by the SCSI Committee for credit approval
- Application for approval shall be requested through the SCSI Committee
